June Scholarships 2019

NFRW Betty Rendel Scholarship

Eligibility:

- Female undergraduates who are majoring in political science, government or economics and have successfully completed at least two years of college coursework.
- The scholarships are given to women who have successfully completed at least two years of college coursework and are U.S. Citizens.
- Scholarship winners may not re-apply.
- Applicants may apply for only one NFRW scholarship per year.

Description:

The National Federation of Republican Women established the Betty Rendel Scholarship Fund in September 1995 in honor of NFRW Past President Betty Rendel's extraordinary leadership skills and dedication to the Republican Party in her home state of Indiana, as well as at the national level.

The three annual scholarships of \$1,000 are awarded to female undergraduates who are majoring in political science, government or economics and have successfully completed at least two years of college coursework. The recipients are chosen from applicants from across the nation.

Award: Three annual awards of \$1,000

Ramblers Scholarship for LGBTQI Student Athletes

Eligibility:

An eligible applicant is:

- an athlete
- an open and self-identified lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, or intersex person; or a demonstrated and committed ally;
- a graduating high school student who plans to attend a recognized college or university in the United States OR is an already matriculated undergraduate college student; and
- between the age of 15- and 21-years-old (depending on age at time of high school graduation)

Description:

Established in 2016, the New York Ramblers Scholarship supports young student athletes who self-identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, or intersex (LGBTQI) or as demonstrated and committed allies. Awardees will receive a one-time scholarship, paid directly to their school, covering tuition fees. Up to two scholarships of \$2,500 each will be awarded publicly each summer.

- **High School:** students and home-schooled students enrolled at the high school level during the contest year.
- **College/University:** students enrolled in at least six credit hours of course work at a junior college, college, or university during the contest year.
- **Graduate School:** students enrolled during the contest year in at least three credit hours of graduate course work at a college or university leading to an advanced degree.

*Membership in JASNA is not required to enter the contest.

Description:

JASNA conducts an annual student Essay Contest to foster the study and appreciation of Jane Austen's work. Several hundred students compete for scholarship awards each year.

Essay Topic:

In honor of the 200th anniversary of Jane Austen's novel *Northanger Abbey*, we welcome essays on following topic:

Northanger Abbey can be described as a book about books. There is, of course, the well-known "defense of the novel," but characters also discuss their reading habits, name specific novels, and even consider history books. In her works, Austen often makes use of fiction, poetry or plays, either explicitly or indirectly. Explore how she does this in *Northanger Abbey*.

Award: \$1,000 scholarship and free registration and two nights' lodging for JASNA's upcoming Annual General Meeting (Transportation to the conference is not provided.)

Automotive Hall of Fame Scholarships**Eligibility:**

- Submit a completed application form indicating a sincere interest in an automotive career.
- Provide an official transcript of all academic work.
- Submit two letters of recommendation supporting your automotive interests.
- Submit a letter of acceptance for an associate, bachelor, or masters program.
- Be accepted at an accredited college, university or trade school within the United States at the time of application.
- Students attending a technical training school may also apply (trade school should equal a two-year associate program).
- Student must be a United States citizen or in the United States on a Student Visa.
- Must be enrolled full-time.
- Must have 3.0 GPA or higher.

Description:

The program has specific scholarships for incoming freshmen and upper-level undergraduate students. All scholarships are based on financial needs and with the usual minimum GPA requirement of 3.0.

Fostering Futures Scholarship**Eligibility:**

- Student must have been in Michigan foster care due to abuse/neglect on or after their 13th birthday.
- Student must enroll at least half time at an approved Michigan community college, public university, or degree granting non-profit independent college.
- Student must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and demonstrate financial need.
- For renewal, student must meet institution's Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) policy.
- Student must not be in default on federal student loans.
- Scholarship can only be used for undergraduate students; not available for graduate students.
- This scholarship can be used along with the Education and Training Voucher (ETV).
- If the student also has the Tuition Incentive Program (TIP), the TIP funds must be used before FFS funds.
- There is no maximum age restriction for the student.

Description:

The Fostering Futures Scholarship (FFS), provides scholarships to young adults who have experienced foster care. The State of Michigan works with individuals, community organizations, and businesses to encourage charitable contributions that go towards Fostering Futures Scholarship funds. Awards are paid directly to the students' institution to assist with unmet need in one or more of the following categories:

- Tuition/Fees
- Room/Board
- Books/Supplies

Award: The maximum award amount is determined annually by SSG. Funding amounts vary based on need and any other financial aid the student is receiving. Future awards are subject to available and approved funding.
